

The Start Smart Program is intended to provide RHA youth opportunities for leadership development, academic and social growth, and financial literacy. The program includes goal setting, career exploration, and post-secondary planning.

To graduate from the program, RHA teens must be enrolled and active by grade 11. Then, youth must attend quarterly meetings with the youth workforce development coordinator, attend the required five-workshop series, and achieve two set goals. Enrollees have the opportunity to earn financial credits for participating and attending these and other workshops, and additional financial credits are awarded to students who bring a parent/guardian to workshops.

All students who graduate from the program are eligible to apply for one of <u>three \$10,000 scholarships</u> to be used toward any post-secondary plan.
